## **Bear Sighting in Subdivision: What to Do If You Encounter A Bear:**

Caution: Again there has been a bear sighting in the subdivision around 8:00pm recently. Please report any sighting to the Department of Natural Resources 424-5935

Keep calm. Leave the area immediately; back away slowly while keeping an eye on the bear. **DO NOT RUN** unless you can get to a safe place before the bear gets to you.

If the animal is more than 100 m away, make enough noise for it to become aware of you.

If you should encounter an adult bear or a female with young, act non-threatening: do not make sudden movements and or direct eye contact; move slowly away and up wind so the bear(s) can identify you as a human; provide lots of opportunity for the bear to leave and don't get between the female and her cubs

If you are being threatened by a bear: talk in a calm, authoritative voice while backing away slowly, leave an article of clothing behind to distract the bear and leave the area immediately. **Do not play dead**, black bears are not fooled. If there is no way to safely avoid the attack, you may have to act aggressively by shouting, waving your arms, and throwing sticks or rocks. Continue to try to get away. *(From the DNR website)*
